Sermon Specific Questions:

1. The title of the new sermon series is "Led By Fire." What does being led by fire look like? What are some characteristics of people that are led by fire?
2. Read Exodus 2:1-15. As you begin to look at the early, developmental stages of Moses in verse 2, you find that his parents were ones to recognize that he wasn't an ordinary child (Acts 7:20). What do you think it was that the parents saw in Moses at such an early age? How are people able to see those things in others? Have you ever been able to see things in others that they may not have seen in themselves?
3. We see in the life of Moses that the teachings he gained from the time he spent with his mother were transforming in the decades ahead. How does this challenge you when it comes to the way you speak and interact with children? What are some ways you can pour into the next generation, so that they will be led by fire?
4. Exodus 2:11, Acts 7:23-25, and Hebrews 11:24-26 show us that there was a point in the middle of preparing to take the throne Moses experienced a change of heart and made a decision to be led by God. Can you recall when you made that decision to turn from your old way of life and fully surrender to the leading of God? What are some of the ways your life is totally different because of that decision? Who else has been impacted by that decision?
5. When reading Exodus 2:12 and Acts 7:25, why is it important to not just know the *will of God* for your life, but also the *when of God and way of God* for your life? How can somebody grow and develop this?
