Sermon Specific Questions:

1. "You can cancel everything but this: Faith, Hope, and Love." The message from Pastor Chad Veach was so good! For many, this season has been faith-testing. From James 1:3, we know that the testing of our faith produces perseverance and many other good qualities in us, but what do we learn about God during seasons of testing? Pastor Chad stated that when you have a big God, you have small problems in comparison. How can you tell if you've made God smaller than your problems? How can we strengthen our faith in a big God during this season of testing?

2. It's so important to have hope for better days ahead. What are some things you are hoping for? How is hoping in God different from hoping in the world? Hope often distinguishes us as Christians from those who have given up or become discouraged. How can you encourage others to have hope this week?

3. Read 1 Corinthians 13:1,13. The gifts of the Spirit, faith, and hope are wonderful things, but why is love the greatest? How has the love of God impacted your life? How can you express the love of God more?

4. Daniel 3 tells us the story of the 3 Hebrew children standing up against the edict of Nebuchadnezzar to bow and worship his image. What are some false idols that our culture is telling us to bow down to? (could be fear, outrage, etc.) Why is it important not to bow down to these things? What was Shadrach, Meshach, and Abednego's response to being thrown into the furnace? Why should we have an "even if" faith in times like these?
